# **Upcycled Foot Stool**

Looking for new garden furniture? Peter has built his own furniture with some spare materials. This project is the 3rd instalment of Peter's outdoor furniture series, finishing off with a very smart foot stool, which perfectly compliments his 2 arm chair designs.



#### 18-3/4" **Top Base** 3-1/2" **x2** Pieces 11-3/4″\_ **Top Base**

### Materials & Tools

- Evolution RAGE3-S 210mm TCT Multipurpose Sliding Mitre Saw
- Evolution RAGE5 255mm TCT Multipurpose Table Saw
- Drill
- Router
- Wood
- Wood Glue
- 1-1/2" Screws
- Wood Stain





### Step 1

I got some old floorboards from a friend so I thought I would use them to make a small foot stool. I began by setting my Evolution Rage5 255mm Multipurpose Table Saw to 45° bevel angle.

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### Step 2

I cut the wood down to length using my Evolution RAGE3-S 210mm sliding mitre saw, then to width on my table saw. Then I cut the ends to 45° angle with the table Saw.

### Step 3

I then sanded the roughness of the sides and edges of the wood using my Evolution mini belt palm sander.



### Step 4

Then I started to cut the 45° angle for the corners of the stool top and a 45° angle on one side of the legs using my Evolution Rage5 255mm multipurpose table saw.



### Step 5

Then I started to glue and screw the pieces together after making sure the top is square I used a strap clamp to hold it together.



### Step 6

I glued and screwed and glued and tacked the leg pieces together using my bench vice to hold them.





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### Step 7

I fastened the legs to the top piece of the stool with glue and screws.

### Step 8


I have glued and clamped two 6" x 1" pieces of old fence boards together to make the seat. Once dry, I sanded until it is nicely smooth and the old stain is removed.



### Step 9

Glue and clamp the two pieces together for the top.

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### Step 10

The top is sanded down with the palm sander and then glued and screwed to the base. Once fully sanded it is ready for staining.

### Finished

Check out the other project guides completed by Peter, including two different styled garden arm chairs that perfectly compliment this neat foot stool.

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
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
